ABOUT US

St-Laurent Academy is an Ottawa based private school offering English & French full-day programs for children aged 10 months - 17 years. About 150 families, call St-Laurent Academy home.

St-Laurent Academy Daycare is licensed by the Ministry of Education to provide Infant, Toddler and Preschool programs for children 10 - 48 months old. Under the Ministry of Education of Ontario, St-Laurent Academy Elementary & Junior High also provides Kindergarten - Grade 12, for students 4-17 years of age.

OUR FACILITIES

Located at 641 Sladen, our facilities include a full-sized gym, a well-equipped daycare wing, two floors of elementary and High School classes, a library, computer lab, a multi-purpose room, a fenced and treed yard, instructional kitchen, greenhouse and a beautiful park adjacent to the school.

Our childcare programs are enriched with music, science, art and daily sports programming. At St-Laurent Academy, we respect each individual and recognize their diverse and unique family values and backgrounds. We emphasize everyone's ability to succeed in whatever they undertake, and provide them with opportunities to do so. We address the whole child through "how does learning happen", structured learning activities, child-centered exploration, sport, music and art activities.

INFANT PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- EXPLORATION & PLAY: during this active learning time, infants are encouraged to discover the world around them by exploring and playing.
- CLOSE & CARING RELATIONSHIPS: learning and development are anchored by relationships with caring educators, who scaffold further learning based on the individual needs of your child. A variety of toys and materials are available to explore freely, and directly presented by teachers.
- GROSS MOTOR: movement is a big part of an infant's day. A gross Motor area challenges infants to become more independent, and more aware of their bodies as they crawl and walk over a variety of surfaces.
- ROUTINE: Schedules gently become routine to provide security to our youngest students.
- ACTIVITY AREAS: the Infant Room is divided into areas organized around specific activities, such as small toy area, book area, movement area, art area and spaces for diapering, meals, and naps.
- LANGUAGE SKILLS: are developed and reinforced using spoken word, and gestures. Basic infant sign language is introduced. Our educators will read daily to the infants. Our bilingual environment offers your infant the opportunity to become familiar with both English and French.
- MUSIC: is used widely in the infant program to soothe, engage and teach.
- **Self-Help Skills**: Basic self-help skills appropriate to infants, such as feeding, will be introduced to older infants.
- **OUTDOOR TIME**: Infants spend time outdoors in the yard.
- MEALS: Food and Drinks are provided by our kitchen and infants are fed according to parent/guardian instructions. Infants will be fed family style, sitting together at tables.
- **SLEEP TIME:** gradually infants will adjust to a twice daily nap schedule. All infants sleep in cribs. Linens are provided by the family.
- TRANSITION TO TODDLER: Infants transition to our Toddler Class between 18-22 months.

TODDLER CURRICULUM OUTLINE

Classroom activities: Arts & crafts, circle time, story telling, nursery rhymes, songs, finger play, blocks, puzzles, counting and sorting, language skills

Social skills: social skills are learned and reinforced. Games and songs reinforce these concepts.

Music: Offered weekly to Toddlers by our Music Specialist.

Special Events: Fire Fighter Visits, science presentations, class visitors.

Family Events: Christmas Show, Year-end Celebration

Phys Ed: Over two semesters toddlers will participate in a daily phys-ed program that could include: gymnastics, dance, sport skills, and yoga.

PRESCHOOL CURRICULUM OUTLINE

Classroom activities: How does Learning Happen - Arts & crafts, circle time, story telling, nursery rhymes, songs, finger play, blocks, puzzles, counting/sorting/matching, dramatic play, language skills, and social skills.

Self-help skills: dressing/undressing, feeding, toileting

Social skills: social skills are learned and reinforced. Games and songs reinforce these concepts.

Music: Offered weekly to Preschoolers by our Music Specialist.

Science: Offered weekly to Preschoolers by our Science Specialist.

Field Trips: Four field trips per year are planned to Ottawa'a National museums and other cultural centres of interest.

Family Events: Macoun Marsh Walk, Christmas Show, Year-end Celebration

Phys Ed: Over two semesters Preschoolers will participate in a daily phys-ed program that may include all of some of the following activities: gymnastics, swimming, skating, dance, sport skills, and yoga.

Bathroom time: is done approximately 4 times a day, or when child requests it.

Swimming Ratios:. The ratio for swimming is 5 children for 1 adult and new students will have one on one time until they feel comfortable.

Nap or Relaxation

Toddlers and preschoolers will nap for a maximum of 2 hours. While toddlers are required to nap, older preschoolers who do not sleep will still have a relaxation period. Infants nap twice daily.

Each child is provided with a communication book which parents and teachers can use as a communication tool, and to document the progress of your child. This book will also serve as a great souvenir of your child's development.

PROGRESS REPORTS & PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES

Two Progress Reports are given throughout the school year and parents are invited to attend one parent teacher conference annually.

Should your child suffer from other food allergies, please advise us, and we will prepare meals accordingly. Staff are trained to use Epipens for children requiring them.

Parental Involvement

Parents are the child's first guides. We, at St-Laurent Academy, appreciate that you work hand in hand with the educators and support the people who work with your child during the day.

To enrich the children's experiences, we invite parents to come and talk about their work, come play a musical instrument and have children sing, read a story, or talk about a trip, a pastime or have them do a craft. Simply discuss this with the educators and they will be glad to include your presentation in the scheduling at a time which is convenient to both parties.

Discipline

Positive reinforcement will be used to settle conflicts. No physical force or mental cruelty will be tolerated. We do not bring down, harass or humiliate a child. Fundamental needs are never refused to a child. A disruptive child may be removed for a quiet down period for a very short while. If a disciplinary problem persists, parents will be advised. In exceptional cases, if a child repeatedly displays acts of aggression, we reserve the right to dismiss him or her from the program.

Program Dates & Hours

Daycare programs follow the school year, and are offered from **September - June.** Tuition fees cover all scheduled school days in this period, statutory holidays, and up to 4 PD Days per academic year. The cost of camps are included over the Christmas Holidays and March Break. Summer camp is offered as an additional cost. **Regular hours are between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.**

Pre & Post Care

Pre-care hours are 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. and Post-care from 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Indoor activity centres, or outdoor play is scheduled.

Holiday Camps

For your convenience, we offer the following Camp Programs for Infants, Toddlers & Preschoolers:

Registration & Admission
